1. How long have you been playing polka music and who was your inspiration?

I have been playing polka music for 54 years and my biggest inspiration I would have to say was my father, Leo Maddie. He was also a musician who played accordion, piano, alto sax, guitar and fiddle. In his early teens he played around the Indiana, PA area. In later years he settled in Warren, OH and had his own local band. What I enjoy most about performing is seeing people dancing and enjoying our music. Whether the crowd is big or small, as long as they enjoy the music is what counts.
